Dear Dr **D'Orban**,

Thank you very much for your letter of 25th November which I was interested to receive. While we do not at present run any supportive group for paedophiliacs, we are interested in the whole subject and are in fact holding an informal meeting here on the evening of Wednesday 7th January at 7.30 p.m. to discuss it. You would be very welcome to come along to this if you would like to do so. I expect that there will be a number of paedophiliacs present; the object of the meeting is to find out how far it would be possible to help relieve some of the social and other pressures which they feel bearing down upon them. It strikes me that the creation of such a group as you suggest would be one very real possibility which the Trustees may wish to explore after the meeting. It would therefore be very helpful indeed if you could be present to put your viewpoint about this.

If you are unable to come to the meeting on the 7th, perhaps we could get together on some other mutually convenient date and talk over the matter.
