I have been visited by civilian investigators Michael Standing and Christopher Lemon who are working for the Metropolitan Police on Operation Winter Key. I have been asked to confirm some information I gave on a statement on 11<sup>th</sup> March 2016. I have been asked about a link between Peter Righton, Charles Napier, Richard Alston and Lord Henniker who died in 2004. I believe that when Napier was banned from teaching in the UK Henniker arranged a job for him in Sweden with the British Council which he was in charge of. Also Henniker allowed Righton and Alston to live on his estate while Righton was being hounded by the press in 1992. I got the link between Lord Henniker and the other three through our investigations, joining the dots up, although there was no smoking gun, it was circumstantial and needed investigating. I have been asked about Operation Clarence and what it was about. I recall that Op Clarence was a West Mercia operation but the investigation was focused around the London area. There was a meeting with a Detective Chief Superintendent John McCammont who I believe is dead now. Director of Social Services David Tombs and Detective Supt Hames from the MPS Obscene Publications Squad. Mr Hames was tasked with carrying on with Op Clarence through his unit. **(Page two)** There was another detective present Terry Shutt. Mr Hames accepted this as it was a recommendation of the meeting. This was sometime in 1993. Not long after I had a phone call from Hames who told me Op Clarence had been taken over from above. I was contacted by Liz Davis end of 1992 beginning of 1993. She was asking if any of my investigation were relevant to Islington. I believed so as Paedophile Information Exchange met in Islington, Righton had been living there in the 70s. The network I believe was there as again joining the dots proved to me there was a paedophile network in Islington. Henniker was involved in Islington through the Islington/Suffolk project. I believe Henniker ran the British Council as an autocrat. He was very much in control. I mentioned there was sufficient evidence to charge Righton, Napier and Alston with child abuse, the evidence was found in the raid on Righton's address. The four were very well connected with the establishment, I was concerned they were being protected. I did not have the evidence to say so but wanted the questions asked. I have documented some concerns to David Gadsby of Department Professional Standards regarding Mike Hames. ....
