Today I have come to Bicester Police Station today to meet with DS Thomas and DC Chohan from Operation Winter Key.

On 24th December 2012 Detective Inspector Philip Royan sent me an email explaining that he had carried out research of various operations in response to information I believed that police were in possession of evidence linking WM-F14

WM-F14 Sensitive/Irrelevant of Charles Napier, being present at parties where children were present.

Philip Royan explained that he had conducted research and reviewed paperwork and concluded that there was no evidence linking WM-F14 to child abuse. I believe that the question still stands that even if WM-F14 was not directly involved in the abuse of children, he should have been interviewed by police during the 1990's over his failure to report his Sensitive/Irrelevant's ongoing contact with children which he was alleged to have witnessed on more than one occasion.

My full account has been previously recorded by officers from Operation Fairbank

I also believe that if WM-F14 had knowledge of child abuse that he had a duty to report it to the authorities. I acknowledge that there is no evidence of criminality with regards to WM-F14

I had long deleted the email that Philip Royan had sent me. The email ended up in the hands of journalist Alistair Jackson. I do not know how this happened. I could have possibly forwarded Alistair Jackson the email in an email chain when I was discussing with Tom Watson being involved in a BBC Panorama documentary. Alternatively it could have been forwarded by a number of people including police officers, Tom Watson, myself, other BBC journalists. It is a question that I would love to find out but probably will not. Alistair Jackson refuses to tell me how he got hold of the email.

Alistair Jackson reported in the press and I was accused of pursuing a serving member of parliament without evidence, this was not the case. I was advised to leave the Goddard Enquiry as the Daily Mail were calling up the Inquiry every day and the focus of the inquiry was becoming me and not the victims. This caused me a great deal of embarrassment.

I have since managed to recover the email that Philip Royan sent me. Although I would like to know how the email got into the hands Alistair Jackson, I am not making any allegations against police officers. I am pursuing legal action against Alistair Jackson for libel because he has totally misrepresented the findings of Philip Royan's email.
