In interview, Father David totally denied this allegation, stating that following his interview with the boy, he told a member of the Board of Governors (identified as the Right Reverend Laurence SOPER) and the boy's teacher (identified as Mr Terwyn WILLIAMS) of the alleged **Sensitive** **RC-A595** **RC-A595** **Sensitive** Father David apparently decided not to report the matter to Social Services, until he had had time to consider the implications.
6. Enquiries of Mr WILLIAMS suggest that he was indeed spoken to by Father David on 4th June 1992, and similar enquiries made of the Right Reverend SOPER suggest that Father David spoke to him on 5th June 1992, when (on both occasions) Father David expressed his concern over the conversation that he had had with **RC-A595** who had disclosed that he was **Sensitive**  
**Sensitive**
7. On the 11th June, **RC-A595** was again summoned to his office and told by Father David that he was going to ring Social Services and inform them of **Sensitive** **RC-A595** says nothing else occurred. However, in interview Father David says that the boy told him **Sensitive** again and that **Sensitive** and asked Father David if he wanted to see them. Father David, who at this point was interrupted by a pupil coming into his office, locked the door so as not to be disturbed. **RC-A595** then took his trousers and pants down. No injuries could be seen. Father David does not think he touched the boy, but cannot be sure, but states that even if he did, he did not caress his buttocks or place his finger in his rectum. He did not consider that he was doing anything wrong at the time but in retrospect considers that it was unwise.
8. He did not give a reason why this medical could not have waited until it could have been arranged with a medical practitioner by Social Services, who by this time had already been informed, and later did not inform them or the boy's parents of what he had done.
9. On the afternoon of the 11th June, **RC-A595** was seen by a Social Worker, Pat ALLEN, in the presence of Father David and his mother. He repeated the **Sensitive** but made no mention of what Father David had done to him.
10. On returning home that evening, he told his sister **Sibling** what had taken place in the office, and the matter was reported to Police. **RC-A595** was medically examined at New Ealing Hospital on the 12th June 1992, but no evidence to support the allegation was found, and no injuries from any **Sensitive** seen.
