DPA	01/06/1983	<p>Offence : Sexual Assault Male Under 13 Victim : RC-A604 DOB: DPA 1972 Accused : Stephen SKELTON DOB DPA 1948</p> <p>The victim RC-A604 referred to an incident in the summer of 1983 when he was an eleven year old child attending St Benedict's Catholic School, Ealing. He alleged that he was a victim of sexual assault by one of the teachers at the school, namely maths teacher DPA SKELTON. He described the suspect SKELTON as a male aged 35-40 (in 1983), DPA</p> <p>DPA</p> <p>RC-A604 said that he was aware of a series of sexual assault allegations made by pupils and ex-pupils against priests and lay teachers of St Benedict's extensively reported in the media in the last few years. This had prompted him to report his own experience to police some twenty-seven years after the incident.</p> <p>In the summer of 1983 the parents of RC-A604 had arranged extra maths lessons for him. His teacher was SKELTON and RC-A604 was to go to his first floor flat on the DPA Ealing every weekend between 3-4pm for extra tuition.</p> <p>The first time RC-A604 went to SKELTON's flat he sat on the sofa in the living room. SKELTON started playing with RC-A604 hair, putting his arm around him and asking him what sweets he liked. RC-A604 recalls that on this occasion he did not particularly think the behaviour of the suspect was strange.</p> <p>A week later RC-A604 attended the flat for his second lesson. SKELTON gave him a big bag of fun sized Crunchie bars and RC-A604 said he remembers being pleased of the gift but feeling rather strange. As SKELTON continued the lesson he alternately put his arms around RC-A604 and positioned him on his lap. He began to ask strange questions of the victim, asking him where he got his clothes and who had cut his hair. RC-A604 became increasingly uneasy feeling something was wrong. At the end of the lesson the victim left the flat and went home.</p> <p>Prior to the third and last visit to SKELTON's flat the victim felt very apprehensive. He had prepared a false excuse to leave (a family barbecue) should SKELTON's strange behaviour continue. On arrival at the flat SKELTON positioned RC-A604 on his knee. He slid his hand under the victim's T-shirt touching his stomach. SKELTON then repositioned, kneeling down in front of the seated victim. SKELTON opened the legs of RC-A604 placing his head next to RC-A604's groin. The suspect stared up at the victim and positioned his hands on the chest and shoulders of RC-A604. The victim said I need to go, I'm going to a barbecue, SKELTON replying I m not going to let you go because you are lying about the barbecue. RC-A604</p>
