

## Appendix 1

### Statistics requested by IICSA

*This is the final version of Appendix 1 to Melissa Caslake's second witness statement, replacing the provisional version initially provided to the Inquiry. It has been checked and quality assured to show actual or best estimated figures for the most recently reported data.*

#### **1. Number ordained in 2019**

The data collected was for the period of 1 November 2018 to 31 October 2019. During this period, 565 people were ordained deacon. In addition, 9 more people were ordained in December 2019, making a total of **574 people** since 1 November 2018 to the end of 2019.

#### **2. Number of ordinands entering ministerial training in 2019**

The number of ordinands entering training for the academic year 2019/20 was 552.

#### **3. Total number of DBS checks carried out (2018)**

The Church has the statistics for 2018 on this point. A total of 49,856 checks were carried out in 2018, although this does not include the checks carried out in two dioceses (who did not provide this data as part of our survey process).
