### Overall Assessed Level of CSE Risk

<b>No risk</b>	Whilst there may be concerns for the welfare of the young person, which may involve the requirement of service provision, for other assessed risks, the assessment or risk indicates that there is no current risk of the young person being at risk of, or experiencing sexual exploitation.	
<b>Low Risk</b>	The indicators and assessment raise some concerns that the young person is at risk of sexual exploitation, and or places him or herself at risk. Concern that the young person is at risk of being targeted or groomed, but there are positive protective factors in the child young person life.	
<b>Medium Risk</b>	The assessment indicates that the young person is vulnerable to being sexually exploited, but that there are no immediate or urgent safeguarding concerns. There is evidence the young person may be a risk of opportunistic abuse, or is being targeted or groomed.  The young person may experience protective factors, but circumstances or behaviours place him or her at risk of sexual exploitation.	
<b>Highest Risk</b>	Indicators, Assessment, Evidence, Disclosure suggests that the young person is assessed to be engaged in high risk situations or relationships or risk taking behaviour and is at immediate risk of, or is experiencing sexual exploitation. (They may not recognise this).	X

#### Review timescales

For those children and young people who are judged to be at low, medium or high risk of Child Sexual Exploitation, the level of risk **must** be reviewed at the following frequency:
