

59. The context for the example of the work we have provide to the enquiry is one of our responses to a child who was identified as at risk of Child Sexual Exploitation. This work was overseen by a qualified social worker. This work would be part of the care and support plan and overall case management.
60. These are individual pieces of work and timescales vary depending on the circumstances. This work is co-produced with the young person and their family and reviewed as part of the care and support plan.

61. We work closely with partner agencies who have supportive and direct links with our local Black, Minority and Ethnic communities. Swansea EYST (Ethnic Minorities and Youth Support Team) offer targeted, culturally sensitive and holistic support service to young people.
62. If Ethnic Minorities and Youth Support Team are involved with a young person where there are worries around Child Sexual Exploitation they are invited to a strategy meetings and planning meetings. If they are not involved with the young person when they are identified as being at risk, a recommendation of the strategy meeting would be to consider making a referral to Ethnic Minorities and Youth Support Team for support. Black and Asian Women Step Out (BAWSO is an all Wales, Welsh Government Accredited Support Provider for Black and Ethnic Minority people) provide specialist services to the Black, Minority and Ethnic community. In Swansea, they deliver support for victims of trafficking to anyone over the age of eighteen.
63. There is a positive working relationship between Swansea Social Services and BAWSO. They are invited to strategy meetings for young people including when young people are approaching 18. This later point means when young people reach eighteen, Black and Asian Women Step Out will provide advice and support around trafficking and exploitation of adults. In addition, I have met with Ethnic Minorities and Youth Support Team to agree and confirm processes of how they must report any safeguarding concerns in respect of victims or perpetrators of Child Sexual Exploitation in the local communities that they support.

65. The YMCA in Swansea provide support to the Lesbian Gay Bisexual Trans Questioning community. They do not provide specific support in regards to Child Sexual Exploitation however if they identify any young person that is at risk from Child Sexual Exploitation they follow the All Wales Child Protection Procedures and refer concerns to the Integrated Information Advice and Assistance Team and the normal screening process would be completed via the Sexual Exploitation Risk Assessment Form. If a young person were identified at risk of Child Sexual Exploitation were being supported by the Lesbian Gay Bisexual Trans Questioning service. They would be invited to attend the strategy meeting.
66. Any Lesbian Gay Bisexual Trans Questioning needs would be considered and included in assessment of care and support by the social worker.
67. The YMCA are not referred to for the purpose of Child Sexual Exploitation support, if there are Child Sexual exploitation worries identified then the support for this will be offered by specialised services or by social work support. Any
