**Purpose:**

Rotherham Clinical Commissioning Group

- To provide oversight and support a victim focused investigation, ensuring that agencies are working effectively to ensure that victims/survivors are getting the right support services and signposted effectively where appropriate;
- To provide a focus on the needs of the children and families of perpetrators (both convicted and alleged) and their families, as well as a wider community risk providing assurance for all groups affected by STOVEWOOD;
- To create a learning culture where themes and any gaps in process/services are identified, solutions found if possible or escalated appropriately;
- To ensure formal safeguarding processes for children and adults are appropriately followed where appropriate across all organisations. This will include other formal processes e.g. MARAC.



Responsibilities

- To report into the Silver Group informed of any resource shortages;
- To ensure there is a consistent and appropriate system to provide practical and emotional support for adults, children and their families;
- To review inter-agency responses to families and provide consistent information before circulation of any materials;
- To identify where there are concerns for any workforce and to take positive action where possible to support, if necessary, to escalate to silver if this is seen as significant risk or issue;
- Multi agency case reviews to ensure a consistent approach in both practice and decision making in order to support ongoing development of staff and processes;
- To ensure that issues which need to be shared with agencies, not represented on the SMG or OMG, are communicated to those agencies;
- To ensure that agencies have in place appropriate policies in relation to sharing information, data protection and confidentiality;
- To highlight success pathways and share these as good practice.
