15. CSE INTELLIGENCE GORSEINON PENLAN 01/12/2018 – 31/12/2018

[DPA] 18/12/2018 2DC - [CS-A56] is a care leaver and has been exploited by Organised Criminal Gangs for at least the last nine months. [CS-A56] was introduced to these gangs by her mother, [Mother of CS-A56] who allegedly sold her for sex to pay off her own drug debt. [CS-A56]'s mother has since received a custodial sentence, she introduced her to [gang 1], [gang 2] and [gang 3]. Prior to her eighteenth birthday [CS-A56] was on the Child Sexual Exploitation Protocol. She remained on the CSE Protocol until her eighteenth birthday. Children's Services were so worried that specialist leaving care provision was sought in [DPA] for [CS-A56] before and following her eighteenth birthday which is an unusual arrangement. [CS-A56] seemed to settle in [DPA] and then requested that she return to Swansea. As she was over eighteen there were no grounds to stop this and she subsequently moved into a flat in [DPA] with Enhanced Support Service support through Pobl put in place. This is again an unusual arrangement for a care leaver but highlights the level of concern.

It recently came to light that [CS-A56] entered into a relationship with a [CS-F303] who police will be aware of. This relationship has now ended he was very controlling of her and used her for substances. [CS-F303] also attended meetings with [CS-A56] and presented as very controlling within such forums.

On 4th December at 12.30am [CS-A56] was collected by Taxi from her flat and transported to an address in [Glamorgan] where she was sexually exploited for the whole of the night by a member of [gang 2] gang in exchange for crack cocaine. A Social Worker collected [CS-A56] from [Glamorgan] on the morning of the 5th December and returned to [West Glamorgan]. [CS-A56] admitted that she had been trafficked and exploited and that the man who exploited her still had her flat key.

[CS-A56] came into the office on 5th December to complete the dash assessment and she admitted that she was very scared of the gangs and that they are frequently in her flat during the day time hours. [CS-A56] also stated that if the police were to come to her flat during the day and the gangs thought that it was her that 'grassed' them up they would physically hurt her. [CS-A56] is clearly living a life of fear and is uncertain how to get out of this.

Police will have extensive intelligence on [CS-A56]'s involvement with gangs and previous physical / sexual assaults.
