Summary

Positive reduction in missing persons and repeat missing persons.
Data re CSE incidents and referrals are relatively stable.
792 Registered Sex Offenders living in communities in the Durham Police area.
High proportion of children under 2 are registered with a childrens centre (90%) and other stronger family related data is relatively stable

Concerns or Impact

Reduction in missing children may have been assisted by problem solving work with Childrens' Homes (29% reduction in MFH in first 5 months of 2019); the introduction of the Philomena protocol; schools receiving feedback regarding missing referrals.

Following introduction of Liquid Logic, there is a need to clarify where CSE data from the Police is captured within DCC (this is being addressed by Laura Malone).

Children from out of the area who are placed in Co Durham by external authorities have a lower rate of completed return home interview. The percentage of return to home interviews for Co Durham based children following missing incidents has also reduced. A recent Return to Home Interview audit showed quality required improvement as well as greater awareness of contextual safeguarding (this is being addressed by Lisa Wood).

Gap in Harmful Sexual Behaviour data to be rectified.
