Progress on previous meeting actions

- Speak to Andy Corp, Housing re progressing [redacted] move on to [redacted] **DPA** [redacted] **Still waiting outcome of a bid that [redacted] has made.**
- Further explore [redacted] as a supported housing option – [redacted] **There are concerns that the [redacted] is not suitable due to it being on the site of [redacted] and due to aggressive behaviour [redacted] can present and the risk of [redacted] bringing people back.**
- Email to South Wales police re chasing up CAWN, [redacted] report and retrieving [redacted] clothes – **Mel (Chloe to email Mel)**
The CAWN has been issued
- Visit to [redacted] on Tuesday 17th September to discuss recent and past disclosures – **Mel [redacted] was visited by a police officer. Check with Melissa regarding if she has visited.**
- Check any CSE-related intelligence re [redacted] **DPA** – **Mel**
This was checked but no information to share.
- Re-referral to Reboot – **Chloe**
Referral has been made – follow up needed as to progress
- [redacted] to be supported to either enrol in college or attend Princes Trust drop-in – [redacted] / **Children home 20**
[redacted] has a job at [redacted] DPA which he's recently started.

Discussion:

Professionals remain concerned of the risks for [redacted] in respect of sexual exploitation. [redacted] was reported as missing over the weekend. He went to a nightclub [redacted] with his friend [redacted] **CS-A346** [redacted] left at 2am but [redacted] stayed later until 5am. He disclosed he had encounters with men in the toilets during the evening and that he stayed in a hotel overnight with a male [redacted] said he could remember a lot as he was drunk. He lost his bag and wallet at some point during the evening [redacted] has not shared any other details such as where the hotel was or who he was with.

[redacted] has also disclosed he sells photos of himself for money. He has talked about how he uses Grinder – staff have talked with [redacted] about the risks to him and how other people can share photos he shares.

[redacted] has continued to ask to be collected from [redacted] **Bristol** when calls staff to pick him up. He doesn't go every night. [redacted] doesn't disclose whose he's with or an address. Concern is that as he's not sharing information it is likely that [redacted] thinks that professionals are not going to be worried about where or who he's with.

[redacted] has been to the GP – he was diagnosed with Chlamydia. GP prescribed antibiotics. The care staff continue to offer support. [redacted] hasn't accessed sexual health nurse at BASE. BASE have flagged with central health [redacted] **DPA** so [redacted] should be seen and offer support if he tried to

access sexual health services from there. CS-A59 can also be booked in to be seen by nurse at BASE if CS-A59 wants. Staff are ensuring CS-A59 has access to condoms.

CS-A59 has answered bail in DPA and conditions have been lifted. Relationship with CS-F53 has ended. CS-A59 is due to go back end of November. CS-A59 received a conditional discharge from the offence relating to damage at Children home 20

CS-A59 hasn't seen Sensitive/irrelevant for a long time. CS-A59 has visited Sensitive/irrelevant CS-B628 (age 17) recently and then was smoking cannabis at the home. There is concern as to whether CS-A59 got the cannabis from Sensitive/irrelevant and if he got any other drugs from Sensitive/irrelevant

CS-A59 got a job at the DPA. He gets approx. £ every fortnight. Most recent pay was gone within a couple days. Not full time hours. Sensitive/irrelevant

CS-A59 is due to go to the cinema with staff tonight. There was a period where CS-A59 behaviour within the home had calmed had calmed, but his behaviour escalated yesterday. Staff try and engage with CS-A59 and offer things to do with him.

CS-A59 needs to move on from Children home 20 due to the risks of his behaviour within the home. Children home 81 Children home 81 are not offering accommodation to CS-A59 and neither are DPA. Professional network previously discussed at the last meeting that Children home 81 was not an appropriate provision for CS-A59

Next Steps

- Chloe to liaise with lighthouse safeguarding unit/operation TOPAZ as to any steps that could be taken regarding CS-A59 being underage in a night club - liaison with licensing body etc .
- Chloe to refer back to DPA to see if they will reconsider offering accommodation to CS-A59
- Chloe to follow up with REBOOT worker.
- Jo Ritchie (BASE) to continue to build relationship with CS-A59
- Missing protocol remains in place with Children home 20
- Continue to manage supervised spending from Children home 20 staff – e.g provide bus tickets
- Chloe to liaise with CS-B628's social worker re gaining better understanding.
- Chloe to request a Critical case discussion to discuss identifying a placement for CS-A59
- Staff to continue to enable CS-A59 time and space to talk with them, as he does share information and also enables staff to discuss worries with him.
- Referral to Thinking Allowed requesting consultation with professional network.
