MACSE Plan

Summary of concerns:

CS-A27 has been subject to CSE in 2013 and a Criminal Investigation took place by Greater Manchester Police surrounding these concerns.

CS-A27 has recently been seen in a stranger's car being dropped off by a male near to the school. When asked about it he said it was a 'randomer' who he had met through 'grindr'.

CS-A27 was reported missing from care on 27/06/2017 and returned of own accord at 01.00 on 28/06/2017. CS-A27 stated he had fallen asleep in a field and had not long since woken up.

CS-A27 stated his mobile phone and ipod were missing and he had done some superficial self-harm by way of scratches to his chest.

CS-A27 very often will self-harm when he has been caught in a lie.

Summary of case discussion:

Date: 11/07/2017

The concerns surrounding the referral were highlighted.

YP has been diagnosed as having [DPA], moderate learning difficulties and ADHD. Can present with difficult and challenging behaviour. Although YP is 17yrs of age has the understanding of 7/8 yr old.

YP has previously been subject of Police investigation in 2013 surrounding CSE.

YP has previously been subject of CP plan for neglect. Now LAC and placed at [Children's Home 66]

Attends 6th Form School and **college** where he is studying **DPA**.

Concerns discussed regarding YP using internet website "GRINDR" where he is contacting and subsequently meeting unknown males for sex.

Reported missing on 27/06/2017 and seen getting out of unknown males car.

Settled in Placement and has good relationship with staff. Has a tendency to exaggerate the truth.

YP was spoken too by Police where he openly stated meeting unknown males for sex. On previous occasion he has reportedly met several males and had sex with them.

Risk assessment completed. Risk rating: 46 HIGH
