D. Eaton asked are we becoming to involved. Should we focus on (Redacted) as an individual in school and make him follow rules.

██████████ said the most that could be offered is to look into allegations and this will have to be time limited.

M. Poulton expressed concern that his main worry is inside school the allegations may escalate and put staff at risk and is (Redacted) willing to stay in school now he is back in.

C. Spanking felt we needed more control (Redacted) is calling the tune. Are we going to pursue his request for an AID's test. Support will be made available within the family .

S. Cohen Has cautioned (Redacted) about (Redacted) as it could have repercussions ie Insurance etc. He felt we were giving (Redacted) ammunition for his shock tactics. General advice from all concerned was not to have the test.

C. Spanking would like to be invited to a further review and will be in touch with the Child Guidance.

Summary

1. Take away college
2. (Redacted) to stay at school
3. Transport to be arranged to pick him up Friday evening and bring him back Monday morning.
4. Home visits through the week to be withdrawn
5. Any allegations about a member of staff and (Redacted) would be suspended immediately
6. It is the parents responsibility to contact police regarding the allegations of the man outside school.
7. (Redacted) must be put back on the YTS list.
