

Bays would want to know who was on duty to establish if a weaker member was on duty it would give them more freedom.

B A was sleeping in his house. Bays waited until they knew B A was asleep.

Remembers vaguely - were there any copies of rota? log books (house logs) would be the key. Handwriting + signature would indicate who was on duty. At the time there was no laid-down procedure as today.

Normal duty was to have 2 people - originally 1 and 1 cover. Problem was that people were allowed to sleep in but not officially - historical from having residential accommodation. People were allocated to 2 at a time - 1 junior + 1 senior.

Suspects on Tuesday evening sleeping area was vacant and duty person's resp. was for wheel school but over at junior

Staff were disgusted by practice of B A sleeping in his house - of no alarms at that time.
