

# INDEPENDENT INQUIRY INTO CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE FINANCIAL REPORT – as at 31 March 2018 (Full Year - 2017-18)

#### 1. OVERVIEW

The information in this report sets out the annual position of expenditure for the 2017-18 financial year up to 31 March 2018, with a further breakdown of costs in relation to staffing and expenses. The expenditure for the 2017-18 financial year is £28.55m.
