

**INDEPENDENT INQUIRY INTO CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE  
FINANCIAL REPORT – as at 30 June 2018 (Quarter 1 - 2018-19)**

**1. OVERVIEW**

The information in this report sets out the annual position of expenditure for the 2018-19 financial year up to 30 June 2018, with a further breakdown of costs in relation to staffing and expenses. The expenditure for the Q1 2018-19 ending 30 June 2018 is £8,021,864.
