

All their other previous foster girls have been interviewed by Social Workers and none of them have implied that [NO-F130] had abused them.

[NO-A275]'s Future Home

Ms Stimpson stated that she would be reluctant to go against [NO-A275]'s wishes in returning her to her natural mother and personally did not feel that [NO-A275] could continue at the [NO-F130]. A further long-term foster home would therefore have to be found for [NO-A275]

As [NO-A275] classed the [NO-F130] as her family, contact would have to be considered. It was felt that this needed to be closely supervised.

Holidays

[Name Redacted] asked to discuss with Social Services and other agencies the possibility of [NO-A275] being allowed to attend school camp near [DPA]. It was agreed that this would be discussed outside the forum of the Case Conference.

Registration

As [NO-A275] was not likely to return to live with [NO-F130 & Wife] Ms Stimpson did not feel that it was necessary to place [NO-A275]'s name on the Child Protection Register. However, the Conference did believe that [NO-A275] had suffered child sexual abuse and the counselling sessions with Ms Diane Barker would be on-going. Ms Trimble would also complete some follow-up sessions.

Ms Stimpson felt there was little else to offer to [NO-A275] in the way of support at present but it was hoped that in the near future a girls' group could be established to support girls such as [NO-A275]

In my risk management capacity I have recently received some info re a claim being made by [NO-A275] (DPA .80) The matter is currently withsolicitors but she has alleged abuse by 2 foster-carers, [NO-F130] and [NO-F109] and I am concerned that they may still be approved and have access to young people. Rod (who chairs the risk management group) seemed to feel that he remembered he name [NO-F130] and that he thought that you would too. Does it ring any bells? The case is held by Jane Allison. Pati

[NO-F109] was never a foster carer but ... as I remember it ... one of mothers boyfriends. [NO-F130] was an approved foster carer; he has not been used since [NO-A275] was moved ... registration withdrawn. Just for Rods information I don't suppose that [NO-F130] is really the foster carer that Rod remembers; Bernard Holmes ([Irrelevant]) was a more significant abuser

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
