Thank you very much for taking so much trouble in your reply to my letter. I know how precious your time is and I feel privileged to have so much of it. I am a little disappointed, but obedience is at the heart of our lives, and I will do exactly what you want. I though I fear that enjoying the lonely Spring is not so easy, when every day is still a hell of just living-through I hope I don't show it: least of all to Michael. - I will cancel all that I was going to do, and only accepted them because I was told that they were totally private to the clergy, and had been encouraged by someone at Lambeth that relief work was a possibility. But they will go. Have ~~no~~ fear. - Sorry to have mentioned money. When I was with you in September you very definitely

said that through the Commission and your own funds you would make it up to £20,000. So that was what I had calculated my funds on. But, as I said, I have food and warmth and clothing. And must therefore be content.

All will be well, I know. - It is a time to try and deepen in Christ. A time to sharpen obedience. And a time to be totally loyal to you in all that you do. - Oh: no I haven't run up any further bills with solicitors: just had friendly advice. I assure you I can't afford the good professionals!
