Dear Sir or Madam

Last November I heard of the result of Cheshire Police's enquiries into allegations of historical child abuse by the late Bishop of Chester and the news that, if he were still living, he would have questions to answer. This re-awakened memories of my own abortive efforts to bring to public attention the information I have regarding the late MP for Chester, Sir Peter Morrison. I enclose documents I hold from when, back in 2014, I went to the police in Chester to confess to my having had knowledge of abuse and not reported it, and the later conversations with various police men and women, particularly Inspector Angela Marinari, who was at the time in charge of the Professional Conduct department of Cheshire Police Force. I hope you will consider the documents and maybe they will tie in with other complainants' information; as Inspector Marinari pointed out, the force had had many complaints, some of a 'horrific nature'.

As well as the issue of the suspected abuse and, to my mind, more insidious, is the fact that someone in the Labour Party hierarchy told Ian Lucas, now MP, that there was an unwritten agreement amongst political parties that no-one would expose another MP for fear that the skeletons in every party's cupboard would be exposed as a result, and I speak as a Labour Party member myself. This seems to me to be at least as big an issue as the child abuse, should it be proved, and not something with which the police alone should have to deal. Of course, once again, the police themselves do not come out well if the information is true, in initially 'rolling over' to a phone call from the Prime Minister's Office and then repeatedly failing to take any action despite a host of complaints and what was apparently common knowledge in the city about Morrison's activities. It is particularly galling to me as well because the committee of which Ian Lucas MP is a member has recently passed judgment on Sir Bradley Wiggins as having "crossed an ethical line" by taking a prescribed drug and also Facebook for allowing the use of millions of items of personal information without permission.

Please contact me if I can be of any further assistance and keep me informed of the progress of the enquiry as it relates to investigations into Parliamentary conspiracies.
