With regards to the Cris entry on page 38 that refers to Morrison being taken off a train at Crewe Railway Station, I have managed to identify and trace the informant.

Green, on the 10/11/2012, called Cheshire Police, she stated that in 1987 a Cheshire MP was taken off a train at Crewe Railway Station following an allegation of abuse, and the report claimed that the informant at the time was an MP.

On the 7th August 2018 Mrs Green was interviewed at Blacon Police station Chester by Civilian Investigators Craig Wallace and Mark Roberts.

Green recalled that in 1974 the Chester MP Jack Temple (Conservative), retired from his seat and her late husband, Ralph Green, had been selected to stand for the Liberal Party.

Peter Morrison, who had been 'parachuted in' stood for the Conservative's. Green felt that Morrison was not a 'local man' and the only reason he was selected was due to his privileged background.

The Greens were aware that Morrison was Gay, but neither her husband nor herself were particularly concerned about that.

Greens husband stood against Morrison at the General Election in 1974. Morrison won the Chester seat for the Conservatives.

The Greens continued to have a keen interest in local (Liberal) politics. In the late 80's they became aware that Peter Morrison had been involved in an incident on a train involving a boy. Morrison had been removed from the train at Crewe Railway Station. As she recalls Morrison was travelling back from Westminster. Her understanding that the boy in some way had been sexually assaulted.

Green went onto say that she had no direct evidence and her knowledge came from rumour. Both the Labour and Liberal parties were talking about the information, which was so strongly believed that a bi-election was going to be proposed.

Green together with the rest of the Liberal Party, were very shocked when nothing came of the Morrison incident, which did not even reach the papers.

Green considers the matter was suppressed due to Morrison's privileged background.

In about 2102 following the Savile enquiry, she recalls reading about Morrison in connection with Paedophilia which prompted her to call Cheshire Police.

Patricia did provide various newspaper Articles from the 'Chester Observer' from the 1970's that deal with Morrison's selection to stand for the Conservatives and the subsequent election campaign.

Green did not provide any direct evidence regarding the abuse alleged against Peter Morrison.
